


Secretly **Sacrifice** something for another person this week.

Safe from Danger!

Flames burst out of the windows. People rushed out of the doors, gasping for fresh air. Reunited families hugged each other tightly. But as the fire raged, someone was running into the apartment building.

You know what to do when there is fire in a building, right? Feel the door and if it's hot, find another way out. Get low and go. Don't take any of your stuff with you. Stop, drop, and roll if you have fire on your clothes. So who runs into a burning building? Who would

willingly face danger, injury, or even death

by heading straight into the fire?

Of course, firefighters do exactly that time after time, risking their lives to help and save others. This time, a firefighter saved a huddle of scared siblings. At first, they didn't want to go with her, this alien-looking person coming through the smoke. But clutching all three, she rapidly moved them safely outside. Minutes later, the building collapsed.

A firefighter keeps people from danger, herding them to safety, risking his or her life to save another. She can't change her mind; she must be willing to sacrifice her own life in order to save the life of a stranger.

Fun Facts

Shepherds were some of the first to **Celebrate** Jesus' birth. Read Luke 2:8-20. Shepherds **Slept** outside near their sheep to protect them from predators. Before he was a great king, **David** tended sheep. See 1 Samuel 17:12–16. Sheep aren't **dumb**, but they sometimes get into **trouble** following the flock. Sheep are most closely related to **goats**.
